Abstract:

This presentation analyzes the Malaysian urbanization process and its urban migrants since the launching of New Economic Policy (NEP) in 1971. The focus of the study is to compare the differences between the Chinese urban migrants and the Malay urban migrants. In Malaysia, migration is seen as a means of social restructuring to urbanize the Bumiputera (including the Malays and other indigenous population), and to bring about more balanced participation among the different ethnic groups in the various economic sectors. However, the fundamental reason of NEP and National Development Policy (NDP, 1990-2000) is economic. The period 1970-2000 witnessed the greatest Malay and Chinese social mobility. This presentation may also discuss the future development of the Chinese urban migrants and the Malay urban migrants in Malaysia.
