On the 19th February 2024, the Vice Chancellor delivered his 2024 New Year Address at the Dewan Tunku Canselor, Universiti Malaysia. The Address was also broadcasted online via the Universiti Malaysia Youtube page. All staff members of Universiti Malaysia were invited.

Professor Dato' Seri Ir. Dr. Noor Azuan Abu Osman, Vice Chancellor of Universiti Malaysia, introduced the UM New Reform Plan Strategy, after taking into account the Higher Education Roadmap 2024 delivered by YB Minister of Higher Education. He emphasised the relevance of the earlier Universiti Malaysia Transformation Plan Strategy but highlighted the improvisations to be made in 2024.

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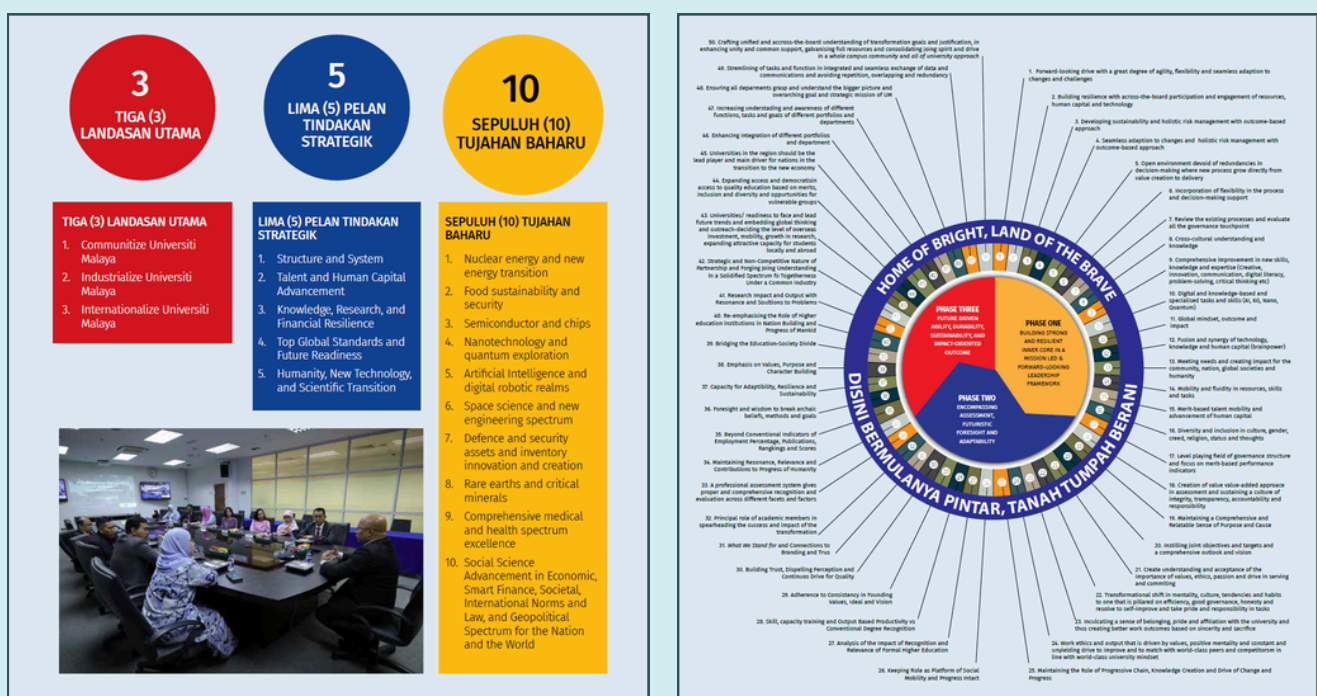
VICE CHANCELLOR'S NEW YEAR ADDRESS 2024



Professor Dato' Seri Ir. Dr. Noor Azuan Abu Osman Professor presented a new strategy framework that integrates three main tracks, five cores Strategic Action Plan, ten New Thrusts, three Transition Phases, 50 Action Targets, and one New Statement. The three transition phases are: [1] Building strong and resilient inner core in a mission led & forward-looking leadership framework, [2] Encompassing assessment, futuristic foresight and adaptability, and [3] Future driven agility, durability, sustainability, and impact-oriented outcome. The 50 action targets include incorporation of flexibility in the process & decision-making support, merit-based talent mobility & advancement of human capital, as well as ensuring all departments grasp and understand the bigger picture and overarching goals and strategic mission of UM.

The Vice Chancellor added that the future of internationalisation will involve strategic worldwide amplification of tactics through new branding, collaborations, and regional targeting and impact, which will focus on six key internationalization initiatives. He also stated that he aims to develop the university into a world-class institution with a future-driven workforce and a pool of talented individuals who can explore new frontiers of excellence.

WORKSHOP ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF TRANSFORMATIONAL SUSTAINABILITY LEADERSHIP MODULE FOR THE NATIONAL PLANETARY HEALTH ACTION PLAN

The Universiti Malaya Centre for Civilisational Dialogue (UMCCD) received a letter of appointment of strategic collaboration from the Academy of Sciences Malaysia (ASM) to develop the "Transformational Sustainability Leadership Training Module for the National Planetary Health Action Plan (NPHAP)" between October 2023 until March 2024. In order to pilot test the project, UMCCD organised a workshop with representatives from various organisations from the government, non-government and academic sectors to ensure that the content of the module is up to the mark.

The main objective of the workshop was to facilitate the development of participants' knowledge, skills, and motivation to address the topic of Planetary Health through our daily life at the personal, communal and national level. The sessions were crafted to enhance participants' awareness on the impact of human-driven changes to the planet as well as to provide a comprehensive understanding of the concept of Planetary Health and its relevance to our existence, locally and globally. The module also emphasised ethics and values as well as nature-based solutions in tackling the multi-faceted planetary health issues. Most critically, the module aimed at behavioural change based on a proper understanding of the concept of "Transformational Sustainability Leadership" as well as to get feedback in the context of future mitigation and planetary friendly strategies from the participants.

The pilot workshop on "Development of Transformational Sustainability Leadership Module for National Planetary Health Action Plan (NPHAP)" was effectively carried out from February 28th, 2024 (Wednesday) to March 1st, 2024 (Friday) at the Urban Living Residence, MAHSA Avenue, Block B, Level 4, Jalan Ilmu, Off Jalan Universiti, 59100 Kuala Lumpur.

The event commenced with a welcoming address from YBhg. Prof. Emeritus Datuk Dr. Azizan Baharuddin, Director of the University Malaya Center for Civilizational Dialogue, serving as both organiser and head of the research project. Following this, the agenda featured presentations by module writers, group discussions, and participant-led presentation sessions over the subsequent two days. Additionally, participants engaged in outdoor activities and field trips to Taman Rimba Ilmu, Universiti Malaya, during the afternoon session on the second day. The concluding day included a Closing Ceremony and Certificate Presentation, featuring a closing speech by Professor Dr. Noorsaadah Abdul Rahman, Chairman of the National Planetary Health Action Plan Research & Education Pillar, Academy of Science Malaysia. Participants also had an opportunity to present their views, providing valuable feedback and suggestions to the organising committee and module writers. The workshop was important for professionals across diverse sectors, encapsulating an innovative framework that bridges sectors fostering a holistic understanding of interconnected resources in pursuit of sustainable development. Participants were challenged to consider the consequences of their decisions, foreseeing potential trade-offs and synergies to enable the design, evaluation, and prioritisation of cross-sectoral solutions aimed at balancing human civilization's health and planetary health. Beyond being an educational initiative, the workshop served as a **call to action**, inspiring participants to apply their newfound knowledge to effect tangible change, and in the process manifesting a leadership that is transformational and sustainable.

On January 12, at the Chancellor's Tunku Hall at Universiti Malaya, YB Dato' Seri Diraja Dr. Zambry Abd Kadir, Minister of Higher Education, concluded the Ministry of Higher Education's 2024 Roadmap Ceremony. Universiti Malaya was proud to take the lead in hosting this event. This event turned into a significant turning point in laying the groundwork for a strategic plan to improve the caliber and excellence of higher education, so fostering innovation and the advancement of knowledge's potential and advancing national development. YB Datuk Ts. Mustapha Sakmud, the Deputy Minister of Higher Education, and Mohamad Azhan Md. Amir, the Deputy Secretary General (Management and Development) of KPT were also present.

In his speech, the Minister of Higher Education (MOHE), YB Dato' Seri Diraja Dr. Zambry Abd Kadir, announced five (5) primary objectives which emphasises MOHE's planning and strategy for the year 2024: Preparation of the best national talent; strengthening the research and innovation ecosystem; new approach implementation of knowledge transfer and sharing program; internationalization of higher education; and strengthening enabling ecosystems.

The YB Minister also revealed 20 tracks that serve to raise the standard of higher education in the nation which were the result of various consultations with diverse parties. He also announced that the establishment of the "Jerayawara MADANI campus" for IPTs throughout the nation will help MOHE's management to monitor the policy implementation. Lastly, he extended an invitation to all KPT members to collaborate in order to raise the national reputation of higher education through exceptional work output and a spirit of teamwork.

GLOBAL COMPASSION TOWARDS RESILIENCE ECOSYSTEM



UMRAN2023 or the International Landscape Seminar “Global compassion towards resilience ecosystem” was held on the 4th January 2024, organised by the Department of Landscape Architecture, Kulliyyah of Architecture and Environmental Design, International Islamic University Malaysia (KAED, UIAM). UMCCD Director, Emeritus Professor Datuk Dr. Azizan Baharuddin, was invited as the keynote speaker. She presented a talk on “The Approach of *Adab*/Spiritual Values in Balancing Physical Development and Natural Resource Protection in Mitigating ‘Global Boiling’”. *Adab* emphasises ethical conduct, respect for nature, and mindfulness, integrating these principles into development strategies. By valuing spiritual and moral considerations alongside economic and technological advancement, societies can foster sustainable practices that harmonise human activity with environmental stewardship.

ROUNDTABLE DIALOGUE ON “CERAMAH AGAMA: KEPAKARAN & ADAB PENYAMPAIAN”



The Roundtable Dialogue was held as a response to a growing trend of negativities in the context of the sharing of information on social media over religious matters. Deeming the issues as requiring illumination in the concept of proper behaviour and ethics (*Adab* and *Akhlaq*), on the 30th January 2024, the Religion, Philosophy and Civilisation Cluster under Akademi Profesor Malaysia organised a webinar entitled “*Ceramah Agama: Kepakaran dan Adab Penyampaian*” moderated by Emeritus Professor Dato’ Seri Dr. Md. Salleh Yaapar. UMCCD Director together with Emeritus Professor Dato’ Dr. Osman Bakar and Professor Dato’ Dr. Hassan Basri Awang Mat Dahan were the invited panelists. The main takeaways from the webinar were that religious discourses are a mode of communication used in the Islamic tradition to spread knowledge and strengthen faith. It serves as a vehicle for bringing people to Islam in accordance with the Quran’s teachings. Besides that, speakers of religion should be Muslims with specific knowledge of the faith and *alim ulama* is an institution that ought to be protected to the greatest extent feasible. Moreover, religious lectures should be given in an elegant way, using beautiful language and a straightforward preaching approach.

The seminar on "Transformational Leadership Towards Malaysia Madani," was especially held to honour the late **Distinguished Professor Tan Sri Dr. Mohd Kamal Hassan**. It is to commemorate his significant contributions to Islamic leadership and research. Prof. Kamal, a well-known Muslim scholar, had a significant influence on the development of modern Islamic philosophy, especially in Malaysia. His idea of a "Malaysia Madani," which emphasises virtues like compassion, justice, and inclusivity, was showcased at the seminar. With a foundation in the moral and ethical teachings of Islam, his transformational leadership concepts seek to inspire and lead the country towards a more peaceful and forward-thinking society.

2024 PLANETARY HEALTH SUMMIT AND 6TH ANNUAL MEETING 2024 (PHAM 2024)

The **2024 Planetary Health Summit and 6th Annual Meeting (PHAM)**, held on the 16th and 17th April 2024 at Sunway University Malaysia, focused on equipping influential multi-faith leaders, mainly from Malaysia and the Asian region, with training on the relationship between planetary health and the physical and spiritual well-being of religious communities. More than 1,000 participants from over 50 countries attended PHAM 2024, including representatives from academia, governments, businesses, civil society, and entrepreneurs. Enhancing Art Science in the Age of Sustainability

The Ecoteracy Centre in California for example has identified 15 core competencies that we need to develop for living in sustainable communities. These competencies include the harmonised functioning of the head (cognitive), heart (emotional), hand (action), and spirit (connectivity) which in reality encompasses the ArtScience elements of life and/or of the human being.

Future solutions towards sustainability also rest in STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) that is enriched/enhanced by art and values (referring to the move from STEM to STEAM/STREAM) among the scientific community. Unfortunately, however, this fact is still not much understood today. The ArtScience element/factor is also critical in the implementation of the MADANI spirit which aims to elevate the nation to a better civilisational and peaceful condition.

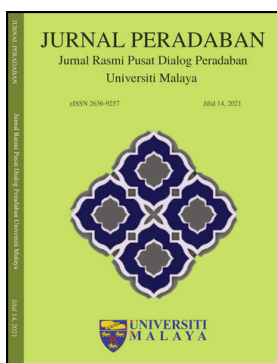

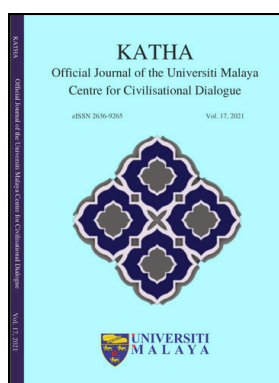
