3.0 Organization

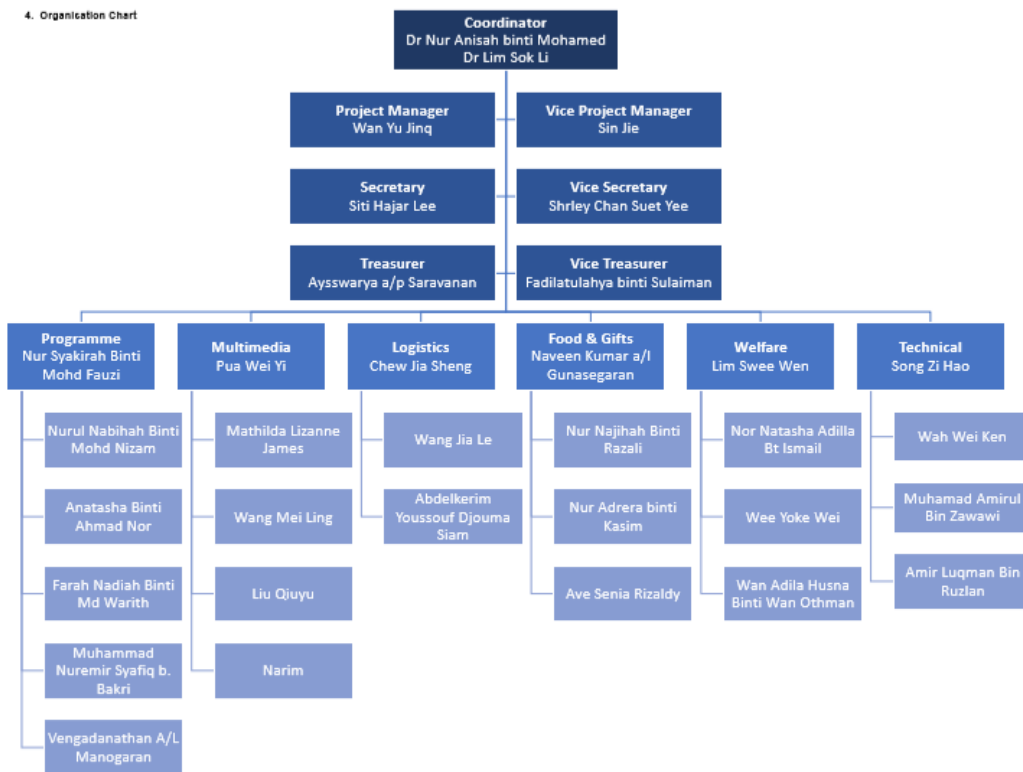

7.0 Challenges and Recommendation

7.1 Challenges

7.2 Recommendation

2. Confirmation with Asdaf Person In Charge about students' attendances throughout the event.
3. Might rent car if there is no one among the committee owning a car.
 - Ease the process of preparing refreshment

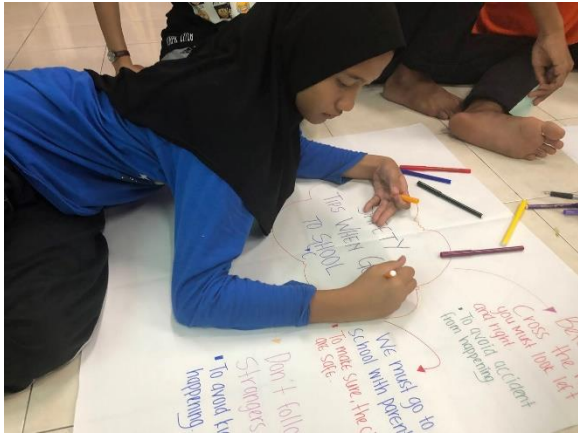
