Each year corruption is estimated to cost about USD \$2.5 trillion, about 5% of global GDP, and adds about 10% to the cost of global business. About one trillion dollars is paid annually in bribes and political leaders loot about \$40 billion a year in their own countries.

Among other things corruption hampers economic growth and performance; discourages investment; distorts natural resource development; reduces tax revenue; distorts human services and infrastructure services. It weakens judicial integrity and the rule of law and overall diminishes quality of life for all but a very small few.

WORKSHOP FACILITATOR



Dr. Adam Masters is Deputy Director Governance for the Transnational Research Institute on Corruption (TRIC) and criminology lecturer at the Centre for Social Research and Methods at the Australian National University. He convenes and teaches undergraduate and graduate courses on corruption and organised crime.

Dr. Masters came to the Australian National University following a 24-year career with the Australian government. His earlier career included time at the Department of Defence, the Taxation Office, and eighteen years with the Australian Federal Police.

In mid-2009, he changed direction to pursue an academic career and, since 2010, he has worked with TRIC. Dr. Masters' current research and teaching focuses on organised crime; corruption and anti-corruption in rich countries; and the influence of culture on international organisations. His current anti-corruption research focuses on the fields of sport and trade unions.

Dr. Masters has published or co-published on public corruption at the local, national and international level, as well as corruption in sport and the private sector. His other publications have analysed the regulation of sex work; political rhetoric by public leaders; transnational organised crime; and the influence of culture on international organisations. In 2017, he co-authored *Leadership Performance and Rhetoric* with Professor John Uhr—published by Palgrave. Dr. Masters next book—*Cultural Influences on Public-Private Partnership in Global Governance* is in Production.
